The service will be operating for the Summer months. Explore this amazing area with ancient ruins, vibrant villages, and hiking opportunities. You can also download the Linguan Valley APP for further information and a guide through the sites and walks within the loop. Members of the local community are encouraged to use the free service to access neighbouring villages and public transport connections to bigger towns throughout the pilot programme which run up until September.

LOUGH DERG THREE DAY PILGRIMAGE 2025

Pope Francis proclaimed that 2025 would be a Jubilee Year and he reminds us that pilgrimage is a fundamental element of every Jubilee event.

On Fri. 27th June we commenced our trip to Lough Derg, leaving Waterford at 12 noon with some of the group, more were collected on the way, in Mooncoin and Carrick on Suir. The group of 23, was made up with people from Waterford, Kilkenny, Tipperary & Cork. For some of the group it was their first time, others had done it once before and for others it was 20 & 40 years since they were last in Lough Derg. We stopped in Portlaoise to break the journey and arrived at the Central Hotel in Donegal @ 7:30pm. We enjoyed a lovely dinner. Our fasting commenced at 12 midnight and continued to 12 midnight Monday night. Day 1. (Sat) 10:30am we were taken to the island by boat. On arrival we were greeted by the Prior, Fr. Lar Flynn. We headed to our dormitories and left in our bags and removed our footwear. We had 3 Stations to be completed by 9pm. Each station takes an hour and are completed on the penitential beds. At 4pm. We headed to the dining room for our Lough Derg meal (black tea/coffee,

dry toast, wheaten bread, oatcakes). 6:30pm we had the Opening Mass. The next exercise was at 9.30pm -Night Prayer and Benediction. Our Vigil commenced at 10am with the lighting of the Vigil candle. At 11:45 the rosary is recited. At different intervals during the night Four Stations are recited in the Basilica and is lead by members on vigil.

Day 2. (Sun) Morning Mass at 6:30am followed by the Sacrament of Reconciliation. 12 noon Renewal of Baptismal Promises. 2pm we had our Lough Derg meal. 3pm Stations of the Cross. 6:30 pm Evening Mass. 9:30pm. Night Prayer and Benediction and 10pm Conclusion of Vigil with the quenching of candle and head to bed.

Day 3 (Mon) Closing Mass at 6.30am. We were given the Papal Blessing by Fr. Flynn. We had our final exercise was the 9th Station to do and we had the option to do it in the Basilica or on the penitential beds. At 9:30 we were ready at the peer to take the boat back to main land to meet our bus. We stopped to have our Lough Derg meal and was back in Carrick on Suir at 6pm. We are very fortunate to such a lovely group on the trip and the weather was very kind to us again this year.
