

MENTAL HEALTH & DRUG AWARENESS

An open night for a Mental Health and Drug Awareness Conversation will take place in Kill Community Centre on Friday, 12th May at 7:30pm. Speakers on the night are Conor Harris (a previous participant of RTE's series Davy's Toughest Team and GAA club player), David Wade (a Psychotherapist / Clinical Hypnotherapist and Youthreach tutor with 25 years' experience), George Henderson (who has just finished a degree in counselling and psychology and is working towards his Masters in addiction counselling next year) and Sergeant Deirdre O'Neill (of An Garda Síochana in Waterford).

As a community we are aware of the challenges posed by mental ill health and the increasing drug situation now so prevalent among young people in all sections of society. This open night will hopefully help provide information on sources of support available. It will also help understand the current culture of drug use and hopefully give an insight for both parents and young people to be aware of signs. It will also help highlight the signs of mental health issues in young people and how best to source help and understanding of the issues.
