Presently there are 450 Men's sheds in Ireland and growing.

All sheds are different; some like to do woodwork, whereas others can be more outgoing and like to contribute their time to helping the local community. Whatever your shed does, the shed experience will improve your wellbeing by keeping you physically, mentally, and socially active. Men's/People sheds come under the umbrella of the Irish Men's Shed Association who provide services to the different groups around the Country such as negotiating insurance with FBD.
