People in the parish and further afield were outraged and disgusted when they saw the state of the Bug Hotel on Sunday morning last, September 14th.

The Ink bottle bug hotel was a labour of love. A unique entry to our village from Fiddown. It will be rebuilt but over time when the funds have been collected. Well over a years work went into its planning and construction before it was put on site. 2 generous sponsors funded the bug hotel, the John O Shea trust and Hickson's. The total cost was €17,000.

Gardai are working with the community to gather information.
